## Mettawa to acquire 114 acres of open space

The Village Board approved the steps needed to complete the acquistion of 114 acres of open lands that are currently part of the W. W. Grainger property. These parcels include 100 acres on the east and west sides of Riverwoods Road north of the Everett Road intersection and 14 acres at the southwest corner of Route 60 and Riverwoods Boulevard. The closing is scheduled for May 7th.

This \$5.8 million purchase is being paid for with money from sales taxes and Village reserve funds. W.W. Grainger sales taxes are supplying \$3.8 million and the remaining \$2 million comes from Village reserve funds that have been set aside for purchases like this one.

## Parks and Recreation Committee working on five year plan

Trustee Denis Bohm, the chairperson of the Parks and Recreation Committee (P&RC), has been leading an ongoing effort to develop a 5 year plan for parks and open space in the Village.

In Q1 of 2015, the Village Board approved a comprehensive open space plan for Mettawa that had been produced by WRD Environment. Since then, many of the study's recommendations have been adopted.

During the past 3 P&RC meetings, the committee has used this open space plan as a foundation, focusing on 4 or 5 Village properties per meeting.



# Mayor's Note Welcome back to springtime

The committee is working to catalog past efforts and plans for future accomplishments (i.e., adding trees, plantings and other improvements). The P&RC will also start discussions and considerations for the 114 acres of land being acquired from Grainger after the Village closes on the new property.

This information is being compiled into a list of goals for parks and open space that can be accomplished over the next 5 years and will provide a reference for determining the budget amounts required to complete the work.

#### Stormwater study update

Mettawa's stormwater study project continues to make progess. On April 8th, Hey & Associates provided a interim report at a Special Public Works Committee (PWC) meeting.

The firm reviewed 30 self-reported items from residents and many of them overlap with the 6 key areas of concern identified by the Village. Some residents reported private drainage concerns that the Village cannot include as part of municipal action (for example, a broken drain tile within a private yard), but these residents will receive additional guidance from Hey & Associates.

The PWC is reviewing some additional areas to determine if they should be added for further study. One of the largest areas requiring stormwater mangement attention is near MacLean Preserve at Oasis Park on Bradley Road. Other areas need culvert replacements.

Overall, the PWC is pleased with the quality of the interim report and is looking forward to the delivery of the completed study in early May. The full report will include suggested options and alternatives for stormwater management and estimated costs.

#### Construction permit reminder

If you are planning a building project, please remember that some projects require a Building Permit. Many maintenance items (i.e., replacing an existing roof or toilet) do not require a permit. Many larger projects (i.e., building an addition, making electrical or plumbing changes) do require a permit. #### **Administrator's Report**

The Village Board approved the annual budget for fiscal year 2021-22 at its April 20th meeting.

The most significant change to the new budget is an increase to the property tax rebate to \$750,000 from \$600,000. The budget continues to maintain all Village

services with no increases to existing taxes and fees. For the 23rd consecutive year, the property tax levy will remain the same at \$135,000. Over time, the tax rate generally goes down with an increased total assessed valuation when the tax levy remains the same.

This month's Administrators Report will be my last as I will be retiring in May. I have truly enjoyed working for the Village of Mettawa for the past eight years. It has been a wonderful opportunity for me to continue my lifelong profession in local government management. Moreover, Mettawa is a special place in which to complete my 41-year career. Thank you!

#### St. Marys Road resurfacing project

This summer we expect some lane/road closures and temporary detours while St. Marys Road is being resurfaced between Route 60 and Route 176. The Lake County Division of Transportation anticipates work to begin in mid-June and continue through the summer.

Residents can look forward to some pleasant end-results including a smoother drive and wider bike-friendly shoulders (similar to the resurfaced portions of Riverwoods Road and St. Marys Road that are south of Route 60).

We can also expect St. Marys Road to be fully closed for 3 weeks so that the railroad crossing can be replaced and the 400 feet of road north of the crossing can be regraded and reconstructed. During this time, Milwaukee Avenue will be the official detour.
